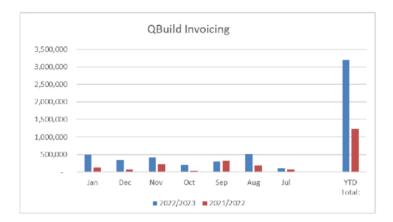
Council's Operating result is a loss of \$3.359M to the end of February 2023, which is under budget by \$311K.

Recurrent income is \$175K over budget.

Recurrent expenditure is \$136K under budget. All expenditure lines except depreciation are better than budget. Budget depreciation was calculated prior to the revaluation of assets being finalised.

QBuild Recoveries have increased by \$1,957K on that of last year as follows:

QBuild R&M's YTD loss is \$239k. An independent analytical review of billing to QBuild and staff productivity has been finalised. Issues identified were revenue leakage from incorrect pricing and low staff productivity of billable hours to QBuild.

#### Actions taken or to be taken:

- 1. Pricing by Building Services has now been reallocated to three Works Dept resources instead of through one only. This is to increase both the speed and accuracy of the process.
- Director Building Services has identified 3 R&M staff who are being actively encouraged to either set up their own contractor business or get employment with existing contractors currently working in community. The current status of this action can be covered by the Director Building Services.

Of the \$4.516M owing to Council, only \$1.132M is estimated as collectable with \$3.384 million included in our provision for doubtful debts. A full recalculation of doubtful debts provision was done at 30 June 2022 resulting in the provision being increased by \$334k. This increase was mostly in the housing area.

# Snapshot: SOCIAL HOUSING DEBT LEVEL (CURRENT)

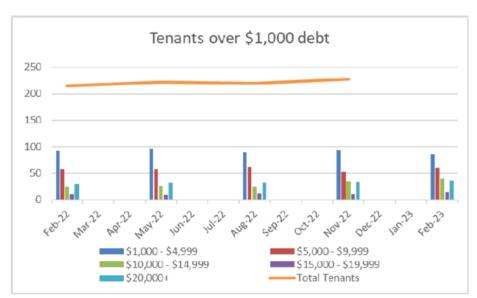
Over the past 12 months, the rental arrears to Council for social housing has increased by 22% from \$2,065,425 to \$2,514,218. A review of debtors has highlighted the following:

61% of current tenants are in arrears and total tenants owing over \$1,000 has decreased by 8 tenants on that of the previous quarter. February's housing debt increased by \$43,492.

The 36 debtors owing over \$20k continues to get larger and is \$1.145M.

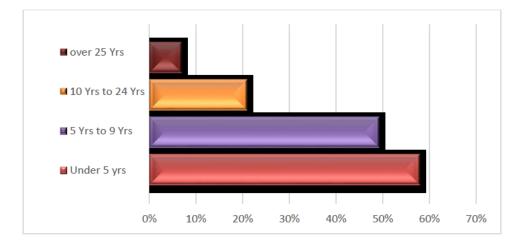




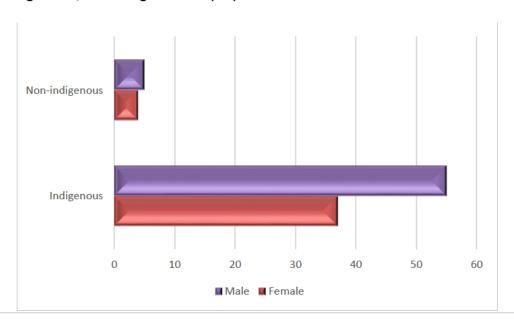
# **Staffing By Areas**

<u>Cattle Grids:</u> In further consideration of this approved project, Council have now had the opportunity to assess the needs and impact on community. Council considers that there would be no benefit in installing a cattle grid without extensive expenditure for fencing around the entire area. Monies assigned to this project would be of more benefit to community if re-allocated to beautification/landscaping around community facilities and common areas.

<u>Fibre Optics extension</u>:- In further consideration of this approved project, Council have now been informed that the installation of Starlink at the Arts Precinct will address connectivity issues in that area. This is an immediate and cheaper option. Council considers that there would be no benefit in continuing with this project. Monies assigned to this project would be of more benefit to community if re-allocated to beautification/landscaping around community facilities and common areas.
