1 MEETING OPEN

Mayor Sexton declared the meeting open at 9.31am.

The Mayor welcomed councillors and staff members present to the meeting.

5 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

Councillor Sands advised that he wished to further discuss the Council Shutdown. He was of the view that Council should pay for all days to staff during this period. CEO reminded Council that this matter had been resolved in the previous meeting and Councillor Sands' view was noted in the

minutes. Councillor Sands maintained that this wasn't fair for some staff that were suffering financial hardship. Councillor Murgha advised that Council also had a responsibility to make sound financial decisions and could not support payment for the full period. He was prepared to have the matter discussed further but held the view that the paid shutdown period should remain at one or possibly two days, if other Councillors were of the same view. CEO advised that if Council wished to amend an existing resolution, appropriate notice is required to be provided and, if Council chose, this matter could be brought again to the next meeting for discussion, with a view of an amended resolution, if required, coming to the meeting after that. Alternatively, Council may wish to debate this now, with an amendment to the resolution coming to the next meeting.

Council debated. Councillor Sands proposed all days be paid. Councillors Underwood and Neal proposed consideration of three days, due to financial impact. Mayor and Councillor Murgha proposed two days, in consideration of financial impact / budgetary restraints. Mayor provided casting decision. Council's Operating result is a loss of \$519K as at 31 October 2024, better than budget by \$2.213M.

Recurrent income is over budget by \$1.92M. Grants & subsidies are over budget by \$947K as a result of the ICFP funding being higher than was budgeted. The increased ICFP funding has helped reduce the operating loss year to date.

Recoverable works income exceeded budget by \$648k with continued strong growth of the QBuild maintenance business.

Recurrent expenditure is \$294K under budget, mainly as a result of staff costs being under budget by \$221K. The state wage case adjustment was paid in November 2024 and this will reflect in next month's figures. Finance costs are under budget by \$180K however it should be also noted the bad debts impairment is not calculated until the end of financial year.

Snapshot: SOCIAL HOUSING DEBT LEVEL (CURRENT)

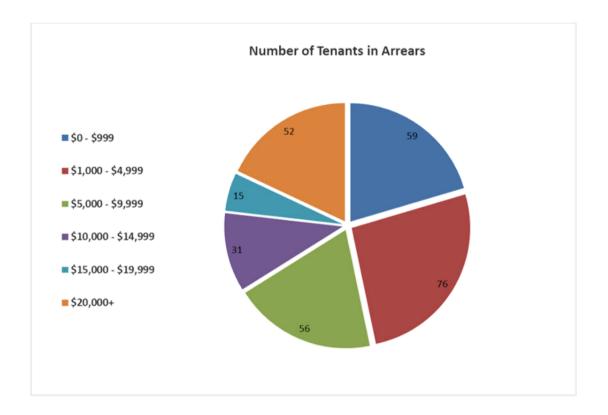
Over the past 12 months, the rental arrears to Council for social housing has increased by 9% from \$2,807,379 to \$3,050,080. A review of debtors has highlighted the following:

59% of current tenants are in arrears and 230 total tenants owe over \$1,000 which has decreased by 1 on that of the previous quarter.

The 52 debtors owing over \$20K increased by 34K from \$1.710 to \$1.744M.

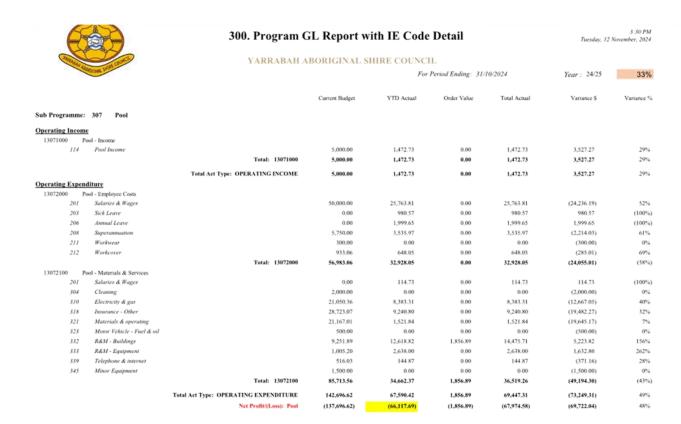

Deficiencies

24CR-1 Adherence to procurement policies for travel related expenses

Observation

We noted during our review of credit card transactions, that several transactions were incurred for accommodation and meals that would not normally be allowable under Council procurement policies unless approval was obtained by the CEO in special circumstances.

The Reimbursement of Councillor Expenses Policy states that "unless the CEO is satisfied special circumstances apply, accommodation will not be paid in connection with attendance at events the Cairns, Tablelands and Innisfail areas as travel to and from these areas in one day would normally be possible". We identified at least five nights of accommodation in Cairns paid for on the Council credit card. In each case the CEO has determined that special circumstances were present.

The policy also states that reimbursement of meal expenses while travelling on Council business will be up to the reasonable cost of meal expenses per current ATO rulings. This equates to \$61.50 for dinner meals in the 2023/24 financial year. We identified one example where 5 x buffet dinners at \$95 each were paid for on the Council credit card. The meals were provided as part of a networking dinner which formed part of a Civic Leaders Summit event.

In all cases noted above, there was no supporting memo or other evidence confirming that the CEO had approved the payment under special circumstances.

Implication

The effect of this is that Council may not be achieving the best value for money on its purchases or may be incurring expenditure that would not normally be allowable.

QAO recommendation

We recommend that if expenses are incurred that would not normally be allowable but the CEO has concluded that special circumstances apply, a memo or other record of the CEO's consideration is retained with the supporting documentation held as evidence of the transaction.

Management response

Management has amended the purchasing policy in relation to accommodation in Cairns and other areas to reflect the risks associated with travel to Yarrabah after dark.

In relation to other expenses incurred, it is noted and agreed this will be implemented.

Appendix A3 - Climate-related financial disclosures

Next year audit planning considerations

In June 2023, the International Sustainability Standards Board (ISSB) issued its first 2 standards – IFRS S1 General Requirements for Disclosure of Sustainability-related Financial Information and IFRS S2 Climate-related Disclosures.

In October 2023, the AASB released Exposure Draft SR1 Australian Sustainability Reporting Standards (ASRS) 1 General requirements for disclosure of Climate-related Financial Information for public feedback.

The AASB's approach is to take a 'climate first' approach and is proposing that references to sustainability in the ISSB standards be replaced with 'climate related' in the Australian equivalents.

In-scope entities will need to prepare a new, standalone sustainability report and have it audited.

Potential effect on your reporting obligations

In January 2024, the Australian Treasury issued proposed legislation as to how it intends to mandate application of climate related financial disclosures (and applicable assurance requirements) to entities reporting under the *Corporations Act 2001*. Queensland Treasury will determine the application to Queensland public sector entities that aren't reporting under the Corporations Act, such as departments and statutory bodies.

Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council is currently not included in the scope of Commonwealth legislation.
Therefore, you are not a mandatory reporting entity and will need to follow the guidance from Queensland Treasury.

Potential effect on your audit

We will work with management to assess Queensland Treasury requirements and guidance, as applicable.

2. EARLY LEARNING CENTRE (DAYCARE)

Overview

This report provides a summary of activities, maintenance, health initiatives, and attendance at the Yarrabah Early Learning Centre (YELC), covering recent developments and ongoing projects.

Enrolment

The Day Care Centre has seen a slight increase in enrolment numbers over the past month, with no vacancies remaining in the Toddler Room. Enrolment packages for next year are now available, which is expected to free up spaces in the Junior Kindy Room as children transition to prep. The Nursery Room currently has six vacancies.

Staffing

Staff rotation has successfully maintained required ratio standards; however, we are still actively searching for a suitable candidate to fill the position of Assistant Manager.

Seasonal Activities and Health Measures

With the arrival of the summer season, we have implemented measures to ensure children remain hydrated and are enforcing a "no hat, no play" policy. Due to its popularity, we have introduced a fortnightly *Wet Play Day* on Thursdays. Both children and staff participate in this water play activitie, which provide cooling benefits and enhance staff & child interaction through play.

Foodcube Production

Our two Foodcubes have completed vegetable production for the season. We plan to replant during the wet season. The recent hot, dry, and windy conditions posed challenges in preventing fruit from sunburn.

Facility Upgrades

We have completed the installation of new toilets and hand basins throughout the centre, giving the restrooms a refreshed appearance. The addition of automatic stainless-steel taps has reduced water wastage and simplified maintenance.

Financial Update

Our efforts in reminding parents of their financial obligations have resulted in a reduction in outstanding fees. As of early November, the balance owed is \$13,522.57, down from \$19,821.97 the previous month. We remain vigilant in pursuing outstanding payments and continue to assist parents with Child Care Subsidy claims, fortnightly payment setup, and the use of the Xplor App.

Upcoming Events

The children's graduation and Christmas party is scheduled for 6th December at 3:00 pm, with a BBQ and Santa's arrival from the North Pole planned for 4:00 pm. The children will perform a concert, singing their favourite Christmas songs for family and guests.

First 5 Forever Program

The First 5 Forever program is held quarterly as a large promotional event, attracting mothers and young children to the IKC to utilize the play area. In addition, we continue to support our visitors by providing printouts of educational materials suitable for children ages 0-5.

Recently, our team participated in a virtual meeting with First 5 Forever coordinators from the Torres Strait Islands, where we exchanged ideas and strategies. Like us, they are experiencing challenges in encouraging greater community participation, and we gained valuable insights from their experiences.

Door Counts and Community Services

In the past month, we have seen a significant increase in community visits, primarily from individuals seeking assistance with applications for the No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS). Approximately 100 people have been supported in their applications. NILS offers low-income earners loans up to \$2,000 for essential home furnishings like refrigerators, freezers, bedroom sets, and lounge suites. This service has been instrumental for those unable to purchase these items outright.

Additional Services Provided:

- Document scanning
- Funeral booklet printing
- Anglican Church material printing
- Activities for the afternoon program
- Laminating important documents
- Computer assistance

Bus Run

A concern was raised by the assistant coordinator regarding inappropriate behaviour among children on the bus, including frequent swearing and non-compliance with safety instructions. Should this behaviour continue, the coordinator has agreed to ride along on the bus to address the situation and promote a safer, more respectful environment.

Study Area

A quiet study space, named the "Study Area," has been established to support community members of all ages with homework, exams, and assignments. This space offers essential study supplies, including pens, calculators, and paper, ensuring a conducive learning environment. The Study Area was designed by Karnia Keyes, a frequent visitor, and we are considering a traditional or catchy name to better reflect its purpose and cultural significance.

The Yarrabah Arts and Cultural Precinct (YACP) remains a vital hub for cultural preservation and community engagement, celebrating the artistic heritage of Yarrabah. Since July 1, 2024, YACP has welcomed 347 visitors, including a strong turnout of 84 visits in October. Year-to-date sales total \$40,470, with \$5,670 generated in October alone. These metrics highlight the increasing appreciation for Yarrabah's distinctive cultural offerings and the growing economic impact of Indigenous arts, both locally and beyond.

Upcoming Events, Projects, and Art Awards

Louise Joel Gallery and Hobson Bay Council Exhibition

The "Charcoal" touring exhibition at the Louise Joel Gallery in Hobson Bay, initially set for November 16, has been postponed to 2025 upon the Hobson Bay Council's request. Coordination efforts are underway to secure a new date.

North Queensland Ceramic Awards

Although Philomena Yeatman was not selected as the winner, we commend her achievement as a finalist in the NQ Ceramic Awards. The exhibition, which opened on October 18, will run through February 16, 2025, at the Perc Tucker Regional Gallery in Townsville, showcasing a diverse array of ceramic works.

Crystal Brook Collection – Bailey Exhibition

This exhibition, rescheduled for May-June 2025, aligns with the peak winter tourist season, enhancing visibility and sales opportunities for Yarrabah artists.

Commissioned Projects

Christopher Harris is making excellent progress on a commission for 110 ceramic pieces for Gurriny Yealamucka, anticipated to complete by late November. Additionally, Philomena Yeatman has started a weaving collection commissioned by the Cairns Art Gallery, which will be on display from June to September 2025, underscoring the high demand for Yarrabah's unique cultural artistry.

UMI Arts – Summer Show

Michelle Yeatman's ceramic works have been submitted for the UMI Arts "Summer Show" exhibition. A media callout is set for November 18, with the exhibition officially launching on November 22.

Queensland Regional Art Awards

Alwyn Fourmile is a finalist in the Landscape category of the Queensland Regional Art Awards. Judging will occur on November 15 in Brisbane, and winners will be announced at the awards launch on December 14, 2024.

Creative Australia Award

We are honoured to nominate Philomena Yeatman for the prestigious Red Ochre Awards, celebrating lifetime achievement in Indigenous arts and cultural advocacy. Winners will receive \$60,000, with the ceremony set for May 27, 2025, during Reconciliation Week.

Community Engagement and Sales

Yarrabah artists' works continue to be restocked in the Cairns Art Gallery Shop, contributing successfully to sales and promoting Yarrabah's cultural heritage.

YACP's website is nearing completion, which will feature an online shopping platform, increasing our artists' global reach and potential revenue. This initiative is funded by BIA-SDFP.

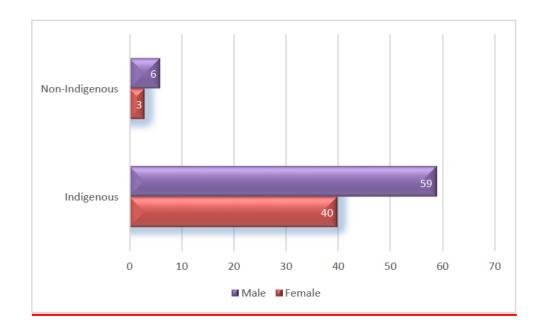








Graph for indigenous / non indigenous employees

7. WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

Safety Inductions

Two safety induction sessions were held, primarily for YASC employees who had not yet completed the YASC Safety Induction. YASC Induction register will be updated to reflect the latest attendance and ensure Council's compliance

LGW Audit

Progress is ongoing with the Improvement Corrective Action Plan, addressing compliance issues from the LGW Audit. An LGW consultant is scheduled to review the corrective action plan on 26/11/24.

Training

- Fire Warden Training: Eight council employees have successfully completed the required fire warden training, including practical assessments. Certificates will be issued in upcoming weeks
- Outstanding Training: One Day Care employee still needs to complete the fire drill practical due to a scheduling conflict with TAFE training.
- *Fire Drill Preparation*: The council sweeper has cleaned the parking area to remove glass in preparation for the drill.
- Fire Warden Uniforms: Quotes are being sourced for fire warden uniforms, including hats and vests, for use across all council areas.

Safety Committee

Coordinator return from annual leave. Although the audit workload has been significant, the Coordinator is confident the Safety Committee team will convene before year-end.

Incidents

October saw minimal incidents, with only minor reports, such as broken windows on council vehicles caused by whipper snipping. No injuries were reported by council workers in the field.

Security

The security team's have new hour which has been effective, with the day security team managing weekend coverage. There is ongoing community engagement by Police liaisons to address rock-throwing and break-ins, targeting individuals identified by name. Concerns have been raised by the Director of Building Services about contractors working on Beach Street, as they have been subject to harassment while working on roofs, creating safety risks.

COEX Recycling Shed Audit

Signage for the emergency assembly area has been received, and a work request was submitted for installation by Council carpenters. Additional emergency assembly signs are also planned for the RTC building and the Works compound area. A spill kit and emergency fire horn have been installed in the Coex Recycling Shed, and a sound meter is now available for monitoring noise levels during work activities.

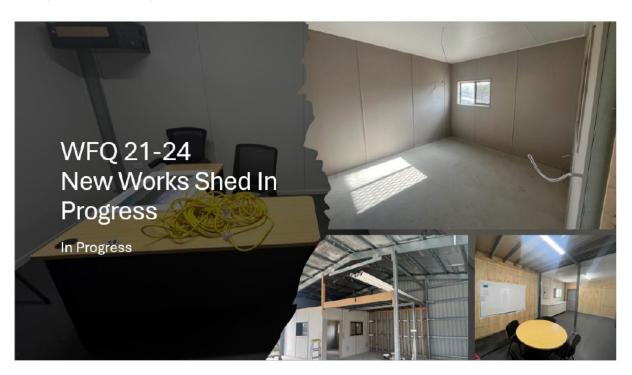

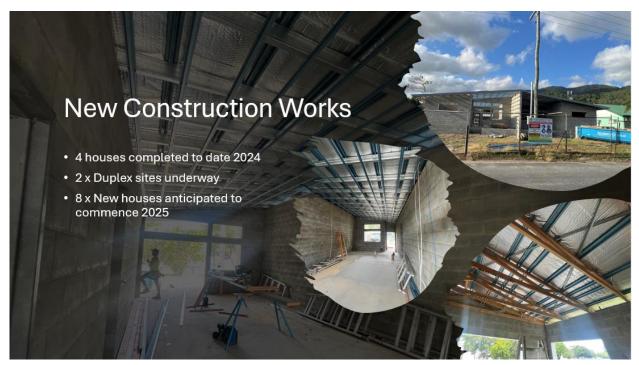

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

(Matter deferred from Ordinary Council Meeting on 30 October 2024).

To advise Council of correspondence received, requesting consideration of a maintenance programme / payment plan for community members who have undertaken home ownership. To advise Council of additional inquiries undertaken.

BACKGROUND

Correspondence has been received from Anthony Sexton of 33 Sawmill Road Yarrabah, requesting Council consider allowing those residents who have entered into home ownership to enter into a payment plan for trade services undertaking any repairs and maintenance to premises (Attached).

COMMENT

There are a number of local trades and services that service this community. Any arrangements for a repayment plan could be made directly between the tenant and the contractor.

ADDITIONAL COMMENT

At the Ordinary Council Meeting on 30 October 2024, Council deferred this matter and instructed the CEO to provide additional information with regards to:-

- 1. When home ownership in this instance was entered into;
- 2. Condition of residence when handed over;
- 3. How such matters are addressed in other communities; and
- 4. Legal opinion as to this matter.

CEO now advises Council:-

- 1. Home ownership in this instance was entered into in May 2016.
- There are no assessment records available. A requirement of this programme is that an inspection is conducted prior to transfer and the residence is in a good and serviceable condition.
- 3. The CEO attended the Indigenous CEO forum in Cairns on 7 November 2024 and sought advice as to how this matter was addressed. No other Council provides such a service. Home owners may seek financial assistance/loans from IBA or ICAN.
- 4. Council's solicitors have advised that providing such a service would be deemed as providing a loan and is in breach Section 111 of the Local Government Act 2009; therefore illegal for Council to do so.

111 Councillors liable for loans to individuals

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- (1) A local government must not, either directly or indirectly, make or guarantee a loan to an individual.
- (2) Guarantee a loan includes provide a security in connection with a loan.
- (3) The councillors who knowingly agree to loan the money are jointly and severally liable to pay the local government—
 - (a) the amount of the loan; and
 - (b) interest on the amount of the loan, at the rate at which interest accrues on overdue rates, calculated from the day of the borrowing to the day of repayment; and
 - (c) any fees, charges, penalties or other expenses incurred by the local government in relation to the loan.
- (4) Those amounts may be recovered as a debt payable to the local government.

In view of the additional comments, in particular legal opinion with regards to this matter, Council is not able to offer this service and the home owner should be advised accordingly, referring them to IBA, ICAN or individual arrangements directly with any contractors.

POLICY/FUNDING CONSIDERATIONS

No policy exists to support this action and may cause issues with regards to debt recovery.

Dear Mayor and Councillors,

I am one of the local Yarrabah residents who was given the opportunity to take on the Home Ownership program. Whilst this was a fantastic opportunity initially, I am now finding the wear and tear of the home over the years has required ongoing maintenance repairs.

I am finding it difficult to access professional trades people to undertake repairs as this is generally done by accessing services external to Yarrabah which can result at times to long waiting periods.

Whilst the home ownership is good, I don't think a lot of thought went into the long term of maintaining the homes. This being the case and the constant repairs that are required I would like Council to consider whether the home owners in Yarrabah would be able to access trade services in located in Yarrabah.

I understand as a home owner I would still be responsible for the costs of any repairs, and I would hope that Council would consider putting a payment plan in place to support home owners in Yarrabah. It is good to have the home ownership program as it is a flow on for self-determination for our peoples, but access to services for maintenance is critical, therefore if Council could allow home owners to utilised local trades people this would be positive for home owners like myself.

At the moment my roof is leaking into the front room and I found it very difficult to have this repaired for both reasons of cost and access to a tradesperson. I share this as an example of what is happening at my residence 33 Sawmill Road, Yarrabah.

I trust Council will give this proposal to support home owners in Yarrabah, and I look forward and await your response.
