#### **PURPOSE OF THE REPORT**

To provide Council with an update on the Yarrabah Microgrid Pre-Implementation project and obtain appropriate support to continue to the next stage of the project.

#### **RESOLUTION 06:18/12/2024**

That Council resolves to:

- 1. Endorse progression of the Yarrabah Microgrid Project to financial close, subject to funding;
- 2. Note the completion of the Yarrabah Microgrid Pre-Implementation QMPF Milestone report to the Queensland Government;
- 3. Endorse the Project Management Office / Microgrid Project Ownership and Delivery Structure whereby Council will assume control of the Microgrid Project implementation functions, therefore realising Council as the responsible authority for all aspects of the microgrid project, including management of project financing arrangements, co-ordination of project delivery, establishing future operations and maintenance services, and project risk management.

This preferred option allows full control of delivery of the relevant microgrid project components by Council. On the understanding that:

- a. Ergon Energy Network would retain responsibility for all electricity distribution network functions;
- b. Ergon Energy Retail would retain responsibility for all energy retailing obligations;
- c. Council would not be exposed to any obligations or risks in these areas by undertaking the delivery of the Microgrid Project;
- 4. Change the name of the Yarrabah Microgrid Project to 'Empower Yarrabah' as part of the transition of the project to Council as the Project Manager, and in recognition that the Yarrabah Microgrid is more than simply a technical solution and delivers more than functional infrastructure, it contributes the community's overall quality of life;
- 5. Be the applicant for future grants including to the Australian Renewable Energy Agency and other potential funding sources, on the understanding that support for preparation of the Grant will be provided by Energy Connect, as the entity that has prepared the Yarrabah Microgrid Feasibility Study (February 2022) and the Yarrabah Microgrid Pre-Implementation Strategy (December 2024);
- 6. Delegate the CEO to:
  - a. prepare and submit the grant applications for the Microgrid Project / Empower Yarrabah Project to the Australian Renewable Energy Agency and other funding bodies;
  - b. undertake actions required to establish the Ownership and Delivery Structure subject to funding;
  - c. establish and integrate the Project delivery functions into the Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council;
- 7. Note and support the draft Community Energy Strategy Empower Yarrabah (December 2024) and undertake further community engagement and promotion activities as appropriate.

Council's Operating result is a loss of \$1.546M as at 31 January 2025, better than budget by \$3.236M.

Recurrent income is over budget by \$2.767M. Grants & subsidies are over budget by \$1.847M a result of the ICFP funding being higher than was budgeted. The increased ICFP funding has helped reduce the operating loss year to date.

Recurrent expenditure is \$469K under budget, mainly as a result of finance costs being under budget by \$314K, however it should be also noted the bad debts impairment is not calculated until the end of financial year. Employee costs are also under budget by \$171K.

Housing Planned Maintenance net profit exceeded the yearly budget already by \$466K with continued strong growth of the QBuild maintenance business.

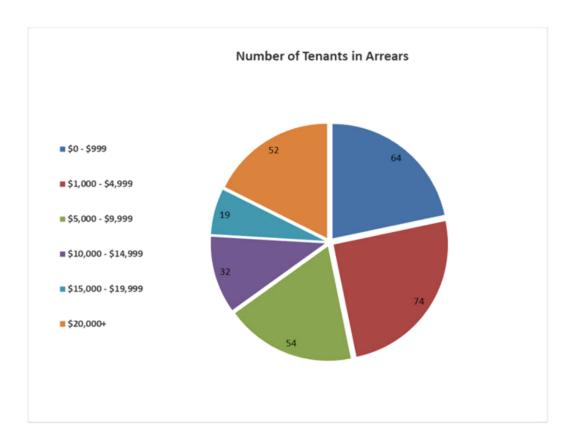
Over the past 12 months, the rental arrears to Council for social housing has increased by 7% from \$2,909,086 to \$3,126,427. A review of debtors has highlighted the following:

60% of current tenants are in arrears and 231 total tenants owe over \$1,000 which has increased by 1 on that of the previous quarter.

The 52 debtors owing over \$20K increased by 34K from \$1.754M to \$1.788M.

Managing risk is part of our governance program and has the support and commitment of the CEO, the Executive Leadership Team, the Councillors and the Audit & Risk Committee. We understand that Risk Management creates value and protects our business.

Risk management is recognised as an essential governance process in support of our strategy and corporate plan and supports our achievement of our business objectives. The risks in our environment need to be considered and managed in an informed way. Managing risks effectively enhances our ability to take opportunities & build resilience, whilst managing and reducing any negative impacts.

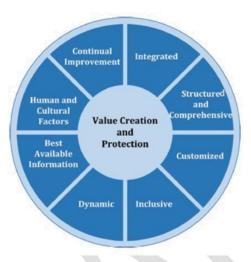
We aim to effectively manage risk by promoting a risk-aware culture and assigning accountability and responsibility of risk.

#### 7. PURPOSE OF ENTERPRISE RISK MANAGEMENT

The effective management of risk will enable YASC to:

#### The CEO is responsible for:

- Ensuring that YASC develops, reviews and maintains a Strategic Risk Register
- · Ensuring that YASC develops, reviews and maintains their Risk Appetite Statement
- Ensuring that regular Risk Reports are provided to Councillors, the Audit Committee and others in a manner that allows them to meet their responsibilities
- Ensuring a formal discussion of Risk Reports takes place at Executive Team Meetings
- Ensuring that all Directors maintain an Operational Risk Register for their Division
- Ensuring that strategic business decisions are made in alignment with the Strategic Plan, the Strategic Risk Register and the Risk Appetite Statement
- · Promoting a risk aware culture

#### The Directors are responsible for:

- Supporting the CEO in the management of strategic risk for YASC
- Providing input and review into the strategic risks for YASC
- Promoting a risk aware culture within their areas of responsibility as well as ensuring risk management principles are applied to business decision making
- Regularly reviewing and discussing Risk Reports at Executive Team Meetings as prepared and provided

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- Maintaining Operational Risk Registers for their Divisions and providing operational risk reports for their Divisions
- Promoting a risk aware culture and ensuring their teams meet their risk management responsibilities

#### Director Corporate Services is responsible to:

- Ensure that the Risk Management Policy, Strategic Risk Register and other supporting documents remain current and contemporary through a regular program of review
- Ensure that regular Risk Reports are provided to the CEO, Audit & Risk Committee and Councillors to allow them to meet their risk management responsibilities
- Ensuring that a program of Risk Assurance is established
- Ensure that a program of risk management professional development is in place in a manner that allows all stakeholders to effectively meet their risk management responsibilities

#### All staff are responsible to:

- Meet their risk management responsibilities in accordance with organisational policies and procedures
- Participate and provide input into risk management as required at meetings and other specified forums
- · Participate in risk management training programs as required
- Adopt a risk aware approach to business decision making

# 9. TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Training is recognised as a key enabler, with risk management being a key business skill that is required to operate in a contemporary business environment. Workers will be provided with risk management training in order for them to effectively meet the risk management requirements of their roles.

YASC will provide the policies, procedures, tools, templates and other information to workers necessary for the identification and management of risks.

- During the month of January the YASC housing team has continued the approach of house visits conducted to recover rental arrears.
- 30 Inspections were rescheduled due to weather event.
- YASC housing is now assisting with the disaster recovery and we have spent a lot of our time assisting community.

# 2. EARLY LEARNING CENTRE (DAYCARE)

# Overview

This report provides a summary of activities, maintenance, health initiatives, and attendance at the Yarrabah Early Learning Centre (YELC), covering recent developments and ongoing projects.

# **Enrolments and Attendance**

The month of January was extremely busy due to a significant influx of new enrolments. By the end of the month, all rooms were at full capacity, leading to the creation of a waiting list for the Tiny Tots and Toddler rooms. We are ensuring that all documentation is entered into the system and have informed parents that there is a 3 to 4-week waiting period through Services Australia for Child Care Subsidy (CCS) approvals.

Services Australia no longer provides back payments, and as a result, the majority of parents who have not yet received approval are opting to wait before commencing their children at the service. However, families who wish to begin immediately have the option to pay the daily session fee of \$45.00 per child.

## Staffing and Training

Due to increased demand within the local community, we have recruited two additional casual staff members. Both have been given the opportunity to pursue their Certificate III in Early Childhood Education through TAFE, with their studies set to commence soon.

#### **Facilities and Maintenance**

The heavy rainfall during the wet season has raised concerns regarding several roof leaks in the main building. As a precaution, all children were temporarily relocated to a single room during periods of heavy rain. The issue has been reported, and we are currently awaiting repairs.

# Health and Wellbeing Initiatives

This year, we are receiving support from Gurriny Health to conduct monthly activities under the "Healthy Skin Heroes" program. Children will participate in hands-on learning sessions covering personal hygiene, dental care, wound care, and the use of skin repellents.

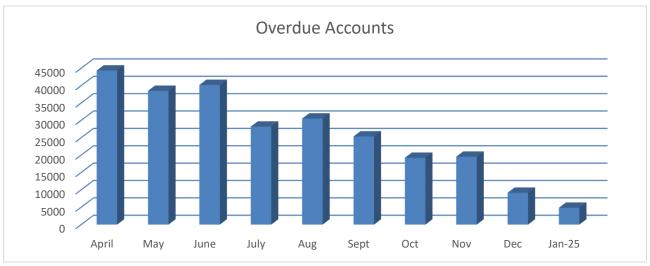
Additionally, we are in consultation with Queensland Health Dental for routine dental checks and Queensland Health Audiology for hearing tests. These checks will be conducted with prior written approval from parents and guardians.

## **Excursion Planning**

We are in the early stages of planning a potential excursion to the Cairns Aquarium for older children. A thorough assessment of logistics, risk management, and cost analysis will be completed before submitting a proposal to the management for approval.

## **Financial Update**

By the end of January, a significant amount of outstanding accounts had been settled due to the enforcement of debt repayment policies. Families were required to finalize outstanding balances before their children could recommence in 2025. Additionally, all accounts must be settled upon a child's departure from the centre. Currently, the total outstanding balance stands at \$4,837.78, reflecting progress in debt recovery through the implementation of various financial assistance options for parents.

## Library access and safety

We are currently reviewing the age limit for children accessing the library independently. Recently, there have been incidents where very young children, some under the age of six, have been dropped off at the library without parental or guardian supervision. While we strongly support early learning and enjoy having children in the space, we do not have the capacity, resources, or trained staff to

properly cater to such a young age group. A review is underway to establish appropriate guidelines to ensure the safety and well-being of all visitors as well as our staff.

#### Book club

The Book Club is scheduled to commence on February 17, 2025, once all necessary resources have arrived. The required materials have been ordered from Officeworks. The order is now awaiting to be picked up

## First 5 forever promotional day

The First 5 Forever program will begin on February 25, 2025. This program will offer a range of engaging activities and interactive learning experiences for participants. Lunch will be provided for all attendees

#### Season Calendar

Efforts are underway to collaborate with the Gunghi Yarrabah Rangers to develop a new project that will provide detailed information about local wildlife and bush food. This initiative aims to enhance community knowledge and cultural preservation

## **Digital Inclusion**

QLD State Library will be delivering training sessions for IKC staff on February 17th, 18th, and 19th. The training will cover key topics, including 'Who's Your Mob', 'Pocket Cinema', and 'Digital Storytelling', providing valuable skills in digital engagement and storytelling techniques

The IKC has welcomed many visitors throughout the month, with people accessing services for a variety of purposes, including using computers for Centrelink applications, online shopping, and web browsing. There has also been a high volume of inquiries about No Interest Loans (NILS) and the Redress Scheme, with many community members seeking assistance in scanning and submitting important documents.

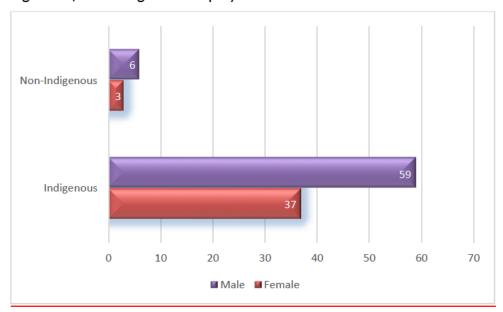








# Graph for indigenous / non-indigenous employees

#### 7. WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

## Safety Inductions

The online YASC Safety Induction program is fully operational. Emails have been sent to all contractors, requesting the names and email addresses of employees who need to complete the induction. Once entered into the system, employees will receive a notification via email with instructions to log in and complete the induction. Upon completion, a certificate will be issued to each worker.

#### LGW Audit

Collaboration with the LGW consultant is ongoing to gather evidence related to non-conformance issues identified during the 2024 Audit. Employees are now required to conduct daily pre-start inspections on all vehicles and machinery, with WH&SC spot checks ensuring compliance. All employees were briefed on this process during the Staff Briefing on 5 February 2025.

## Training

The WH&S Coordinator will discuss training requirements for the outside workforce during the next staff briefing to assess workforce needs. Additionally, a trainee has been assigned to the WH&S team for a 12-month period to complete a Certificate IV in Workplace Health & Safety. The trainee has made a positive start to their role.

#### Safety Committee

The WH&S Coordinator will send out invitations to Safety Committee members for the first meeting of 2025 by 14 February 2025. The committee will focus on addressing safety issues and fostering a stronger voice within YASC. The Coordinator has proposed increasing the committee's presence on council worksites through walk-through inspections of the works compound, work sites, and carpenter sheds.

## **Incidents**

A council employee sustained a back injury last week while lifting sandbags for the RTC building. The employee visited the local hospital and has been placed on light duties for a few weeks. The incident will be discussed at the next staff briefing to reinforce proper lifting techniques.

# Security

The security team has been proactive in addressing issues, including moving juveniles from council property and identifying problems with lighting and security cameras around council buildings.

Heavy rains caused flooding at the security office last week, with water reaching 100mm in the undercover walkway and flooding the training rooms. The security team cleaned and mopped the office before resuming patrols.

## First Aid

A new First Aid kit was ordered for the local pool after the previous kit was damaged during a break-in last month. The WH&S Coordinator will meet with First Aiders in each department to clarify their roles in monitoring and maintaining their department's First Aid Kits.

# **Drug and Alcohol**

All drug test results conducted during this reporting period were negative.

#### **PURPOSE OF THE REPORT**

To report to Council the status/activities of Building Services areas for the months of January 2025 to February 2025.

#### **FOCUS AREAS**

# The focus for the Building Services Department over this period:

- We are fine tuning the new Ontraq software and problems/issues are being resolved to ensure
  everything is working as it should. I have held two contractor's meetings so far to gauge any
  issues or problems arising from the change of software and to gain feedback from all who are
  using this.
- Asset auditing The audit was conducted by external auditors with council providing assistance where required.
- Asbestos register for council owned buildings The register was worked on over the Christmas break and was in place early January. Ongoing work will be required to get this to where it needs to be but at least the basis of the register is now on file.
- Security of council buildings Ongoing Attempted break-ins are having to be repaired on a continual basis.
- Upgrade program We are really starting to push hard now to have upgrades completed. The
  next financial year is not that far away so we need to complete the vast majority of upgrades
  before the 2025/2026 program starts.
- Wet season repair works (Social Housing) Many leaks have been reported and we have been working through these as soon as possible to minimise the inconvenience/damage caused.

# JANUARY/FEBRUARY WEATHER EVENT REPORT

As we all know there has been an abnormal amount of rainfall for many councils around Far North and Yarrabah certainly had not missed out. There have been numerous reports from tenants and some reports from businesses who have had water ingress into buildings. Our department along with assistance from others have inspected all council assets to determine and report on any damage that may have been caused by this weather event.

## Below is a brief summary:

- RTC building <u>Major water ingress through offices</u>. Quotes have been obtained and this is currently at claim status. Once this claim has been finalised we will then proceed with the appropriate response. There have been several roof leaks through the roof identified which is being dealt with via a PO to contractor.
- Main administration building <u>Minor water ingress through the roof membrane</u>. This is being treated as a maintenance issue. Contractors on site this morning and problems are being identified.

- Museum No stormwater issues to report however there is a small leak to the museum building which is an ongoing leak stemming from the known condition of the roof. We have a quote for the roof works and this will progress to a job in due course. A window to an office appears to be the cause of a puddle of water under a desk. It looks like the overflow slots are blocked with dirt and water backed up in the window frame and overflowed onto the floor during driving heavy rain. This will be dealt with under maintenance and we will have the track cleaned as soon as possible which should sort out this problem.
- Jilara Oval <u>Minor</u> water leak running down the wall above a window due to water ingress through the roof membrane. The fix has been identified and this will be completed once materials are delivered.
- Works office <u>Minor</u> water ingress through the roof membrane in several places. Too many other issues to deal with but as this issue is only minor this will be fixed when contractors are available.
- Community Hall and Leisure Centre No stormwater issues to report
- Supermarket building <u>No stormwater issues to report</u>
- PCYC/Place of Refuge <u>No stormwater issues to report.</u> Minor water ingress through the roof membrane which were known. Roof report is planned which will determine the course of action required.
- All other council buildings <u>No stormwater issues to report</u>

#### QBUILD

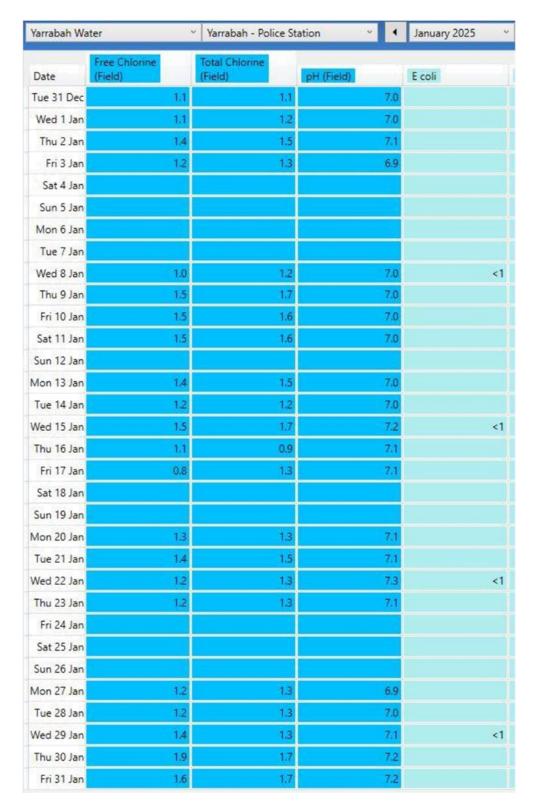

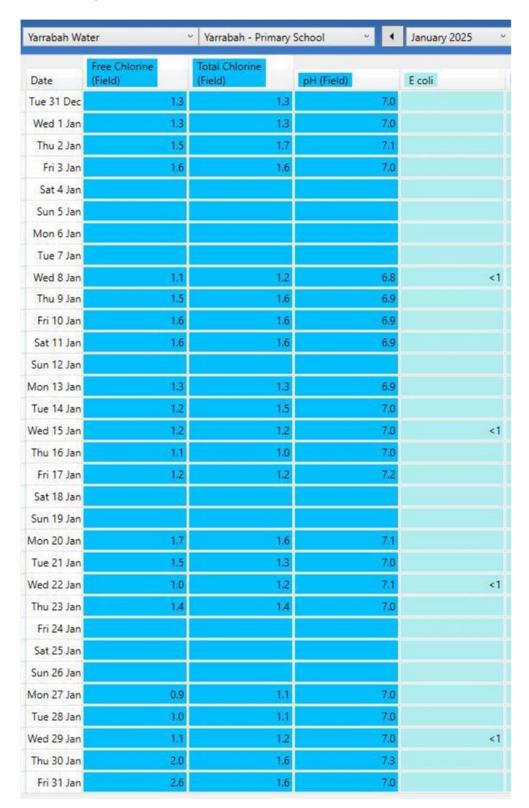

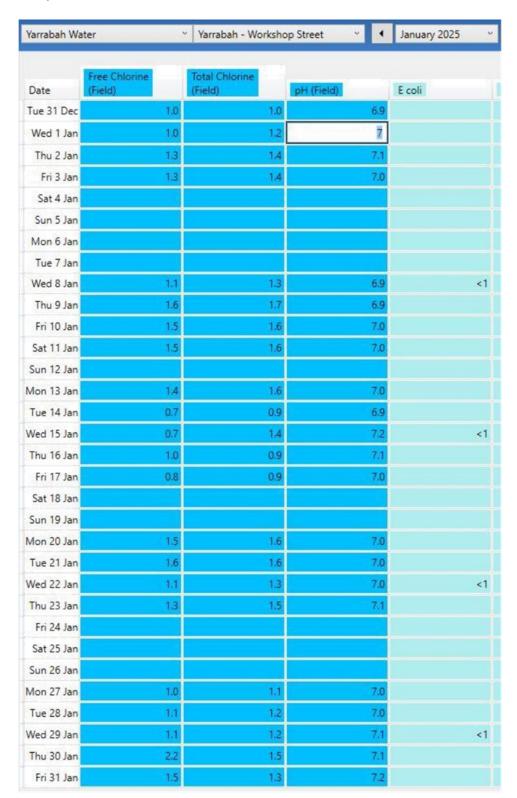
